

Wellbe Bartsma is a licensed architect and project designer at Gensler's Las Vegas office with experience in a variety of project types: hospitality, office buildings, workplace, retail, education, mixed-use, residential, and urban design. Wellbe has worked with many Gensler offices. This has allowed him to advance his knowledge of building design in different markets as well as more technical skills of building in different climates. He is an instrumental part of the design team from the initial visualization process through construction. As a core member of the team, Wellbe is heavily involved in client meetings, presentations, as well as holding client relationships.

Growing up in rural Washington state, Wellbe was raised on a farm, miles outside of the nearest town. Knowing he wanted to be an architect from an early age, he has always had a wanderlust to travel to any city and explore. He attended Washington State University and obtained a Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies with a Minor in Construction Management in May of 2011. With a strong passion for urban design and tall buildings, he moved to Chicago and obtained his Master of Architecture from Illinois Institute of Technology in May of 2013. During his graduate program, he studied diligently under Professor Peter Land on wide-span and tall-building design, with an emphasis on wind's effects on building shape and how buildings can be oriented and shaped to harness the wind's energy.

Following his graduation from IIT, Wellbe moved to Las Vegas to pursue his career and interest in hospitality design. He started working as an Architectural Project Coordinator for Steelman Partners, through 2017. Following Steelman Partners, he moved on to Gensler's Las Vegas office as a Technical Designer. In Fall of 2019 he was promoted to an Associate at Gensler which gave him vision into leadership discussions and brought mentorship opportunities to junior designers.

Wellbe passed all his Architecture Registration Exams and became a Registered Architect in the state of Nevada in June 2019, also holding his NCARB certificate. He is passionate about sustainability in the built environment and has worked as part of the Gensler Cities Climate Challenge (GC3), an initiative whose goal is to eliminate all net emissions associated with Gensler's work by 2030. He strives to make more of an environmental impact in his work and obtained his LEED AP BD+C accreditation in July of 2020.

During his time at Gensler, he volunteered to chair the gFit committee, devoted to promoting health and wellbeing in and around the workplace. This included planning Wellbeing Awareness Week, focused on events and education: encouraging taking walking breaks, eating healthy, connecting with the outdoors, ergonomics in the workplace, etc. He has grown into a leader at Gensler, helping lead the offices recruitment and hiring endeavors, as well as leads a weekly business development call with the companies regional leaders in all practice areas, helping to provide strategic solutions to increase Genslers local presense in Las Vegas. He has also been entrusted as the offices Design Experience leader, one of Genslers five Design Synergy nodes which helps promote Genslers design talent, culture, and experimentation.

Gensler has taken part as a mentorship partner for the AIA High School Design Competition, of which Wellbe serves as a mentor and assists in judging. He also exposed students at a local urban high school to the field of architecture by presenting design projects he was involved with and taking questions about the field of design. Wellbe's volunteer experience also includes working as a 'Big Brother' in the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southern Nevada program from 2014-2015.

Based on his passion for the development and future growth of Las Vegas, Wellbe brought the opportunity for Gensler to join the Downtown Vegas Alliance to office leadership. He currently serves as the liaison between Gensler and the Alliance during these events. He has a keen interest in the architectural community and loves meeting new people in the city, making connections as well as connecting others in our industry. He can often be seen at other industry events, such as Network of Executive Women in Hospitality (NEWH), now coined as the Hospitality Industry Network, and the International Interior Design Association (IIDA) to name a few.

Wellbe is actively involved in the American Institute of Architects. He has served as the AIA Las Vegas Emerging Professionals Director for the last year, helping further promote and connect those in the profession among the community by starting a Firm Crawl series at local firms. These events have been well received and many future 'crawls' are already scheduled due to the success. Other events include local site visits of projects under construction. The site visits are open to all in the industry, but still gathers the interest of students and professionals alike, serving as a great networking opportunity and connecting those of all ages and experience in our city. In March, Wellbe planned the monthly AIA meeting in conjunction with the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) for an enjoyable evening to celebrate Landscape Architecture month.

He has also served as the Young Architect Representative for Nevada for 2023, of which Wellbe has worked closely with other representatives from other states to promote advocacy in the profession, and just started the Emerging Professional Friendly Firm Recognition Survey, which will help firms in Nevada be recognized for empowering young professionals. Wellbe was just recently appointed to AIA Nevada Strategic Council set to begin in 2024, of which he will continue to help make a difference and bring ideas to the larger stage in efforts to further improve the architecture profession. He looks forward to further professional growth, dovetailed with promotion of the architectural industry in the years to come.

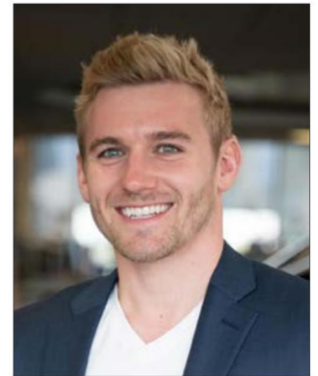
As with many people, I'd like to think my past has helped mold me into who I am today. Being brought up on a farm in central Washington state, I learned the value of good work ethic, teamwork, and how important it is to meet deadlines at an early age. When the crops are ready, they're READY and you better be quick to get everything harvested by the time that thundercloud approaches. I knew I wanted to be an architect from an early age and always had a wanderlust to travel to any city and explore. Coming from the wide-open fields and walking into a dense urban environment was a whole other world for me, and I wanted to be a part of it! Now that I'm a licensed architect, I enjoy coming into work every day and collaborating with amazing talent to help better our built environment. I now work on amazing projects inside and outside of Las Vegas, focusing on urban and tall building design, master planning, and hospitality design. When I'm not working away, one of my favorite things to do is do yardwork and landscaping in my backyard. As my dad likes to say, 'You can take the boy out of the farm, but you can't take the farm out of the boy.'

What is the most important thing you've learned? Be Confident! A little confidence goes a long way when you are creating, presenting to clients, or really anything in life! I'll be honest when I say I have times of self-doubt when a certain task gets too hard. I've learned to step away, go for a walk and take a breather to try and clear my mind. Upon approaching the task again, I almost always have a clear direction or path ahead. Confidence helps us keep going if things don't quite work out the first time, and it helps us move forward with new opportunities. Always believe in yourself and you'll be surprised at what you can achieve!

What is your favorite piece of architecture? Why? The John Hancock Center in Chicago. The way the structure of the tower is expressed on the perimeter and the tapering of the tower that help brace the tower against the wind loads is fascinating to me. It's such a powerful building when you're in its presence, and to think how revolutionary it was during its construction in the 1960's, yet still such a great statement today shows how timeless it is.

What person, living or dead, would you most like to talk with? Relating to our industry, I would have to say my thesis professor from IIT, Peter Land. He really challenged me, and I believe I learned some of the most valuable insights to design from him. His studio focused on sustainable long-span and high-rise architecture, believing that architects need to address renewable resources and energy conservation in a world where fossil fuels are diminishing. He would always gladly take the time to sit and have conversations about design, his experiences and we would explore methods in which our studio projects could harvest energy to be self-sufficient. I was saddened to hear of his passing in 2020.

How do you think the profession will evolve in the next 5-10 years? Resiliency in design and construction will be more important in the next few years. We all keep hearing about renewable energy and finding sustainable ways to power our buildings, but it will become more important to find ways to achieve carbon neutrality. We can only truly achieve this if we remove the embodied carbon used in constructing buildings, as well as the emissions related to using buildings.

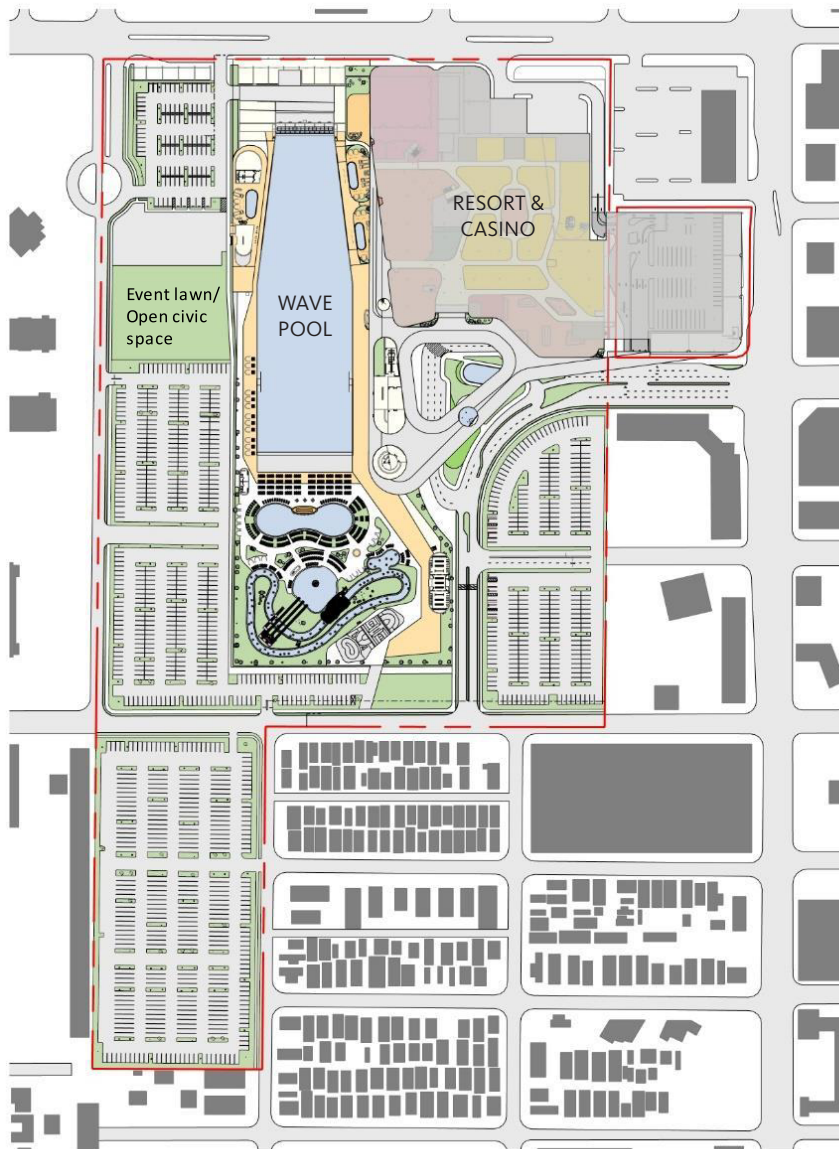

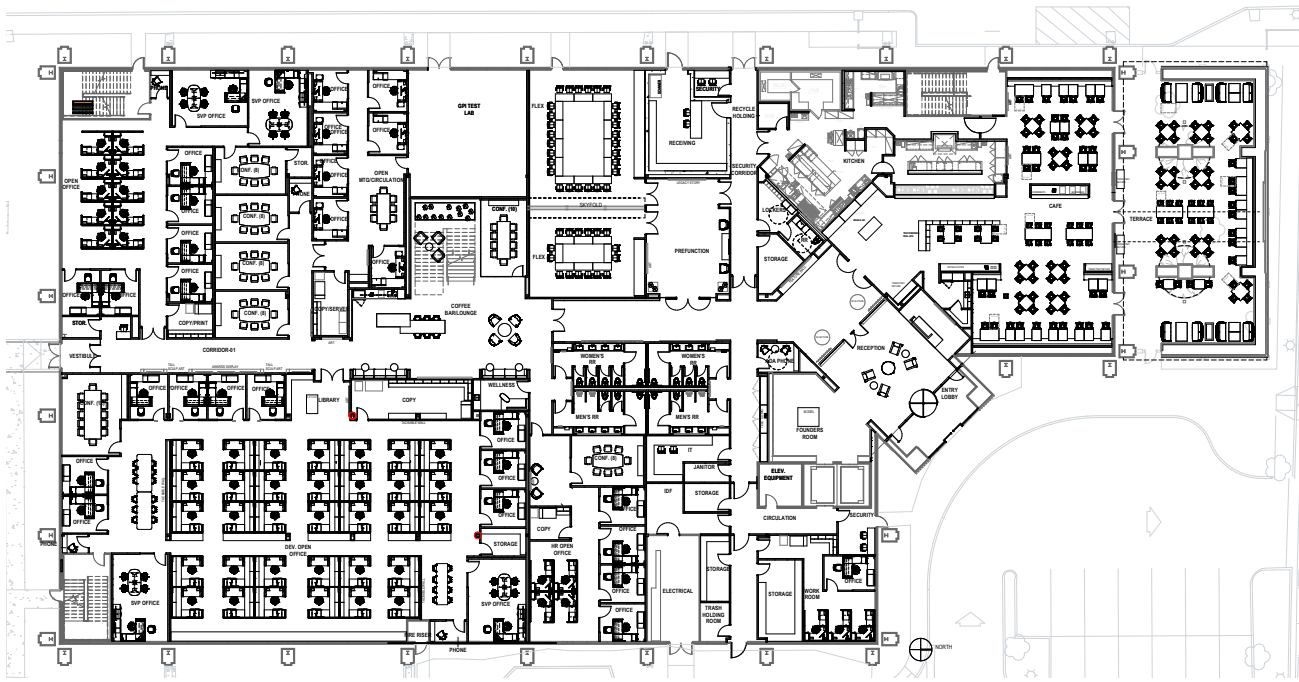
